



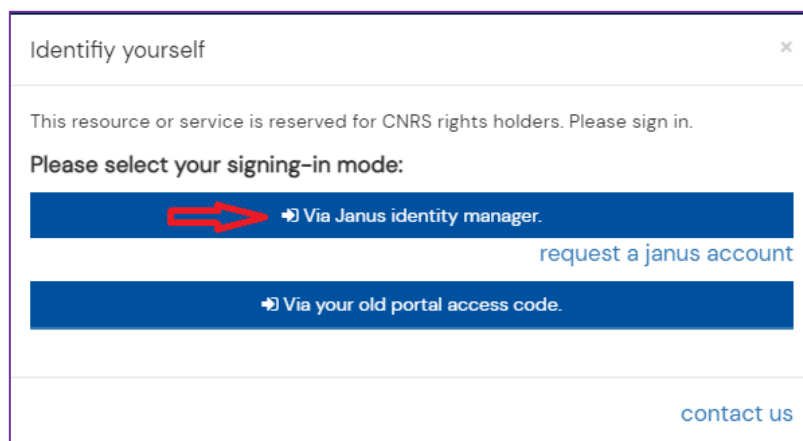
How do I sign in to BibCnrs ?

1. Mainly sign in using the Janus account

- Click on “**Sign In**”



- Click on “***Via Janus identity manager***”




- Enter your email visible in the [CNRS Labintel/Réséda directory](#) and your password
- Click on “***Connexion***”


- You are now connected and have your personal profile.

Below the search box :


- your favorite resources (pinned in BibCnrs after a search)
- your personal resources (added manually)





2. You do not have a JANUS account yet

- After clicking on “Sign in”
- Click on “request a Janus account “



- Change language to English by clicking on EN




- Select “**CNRS Units staff**”
- “**Enter your email address**” which corresponds to your email address [visible in Labintel/Réséda](#) and which will become your Janus identifier
- Check “**I am not a robot**”
- An email will be sent to your address, containing a link that allows you, for a limited time, to enter a new password.

3. Sign in with your old portal account

If you do not yet have a Janus account or if the Janus service is unavailable, you can temporarily use your old portal access code.

- After clicking on ***“Sign In”***
- Click on ***“Via your old portal access code ”***
- Enter your login and password sent by Inist-Cnrs
